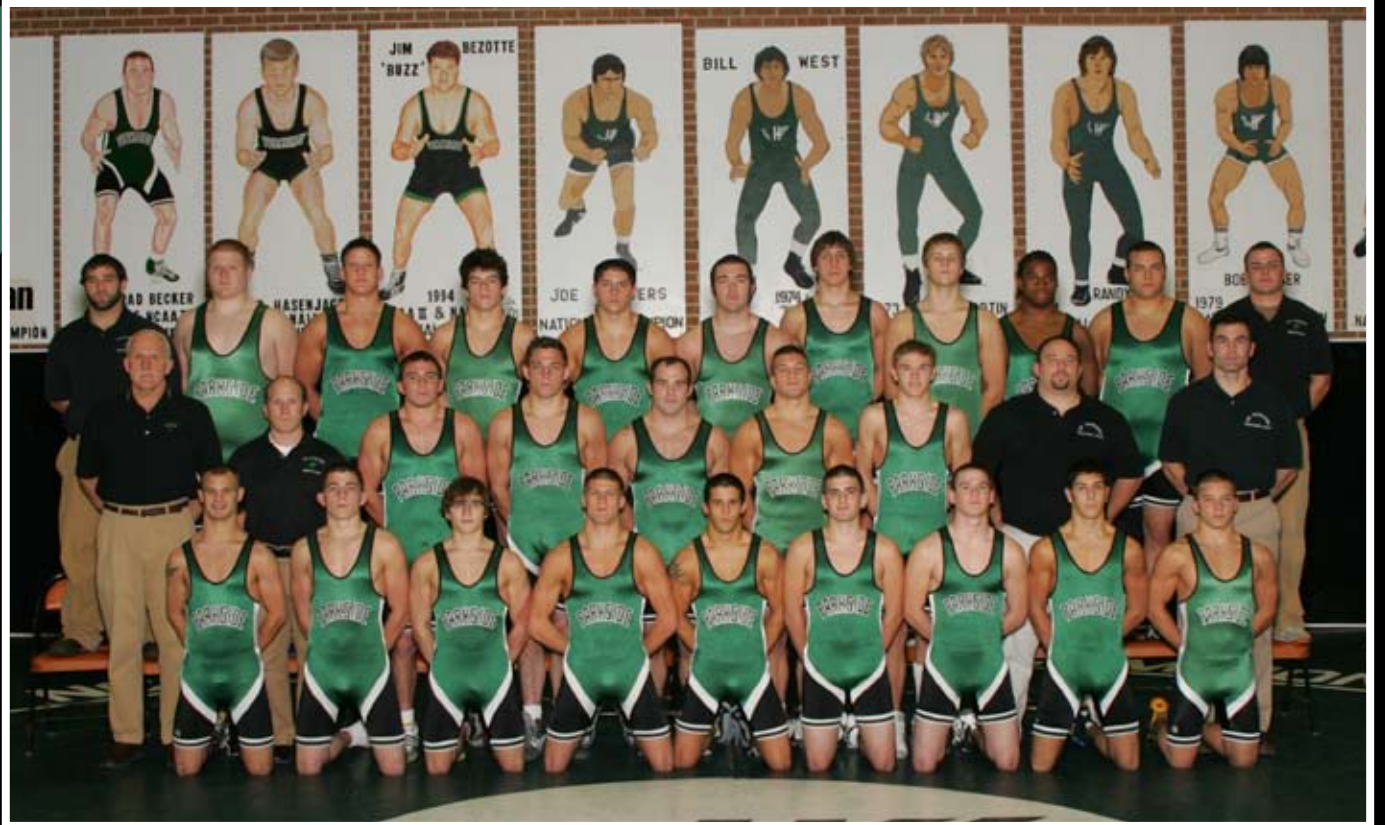

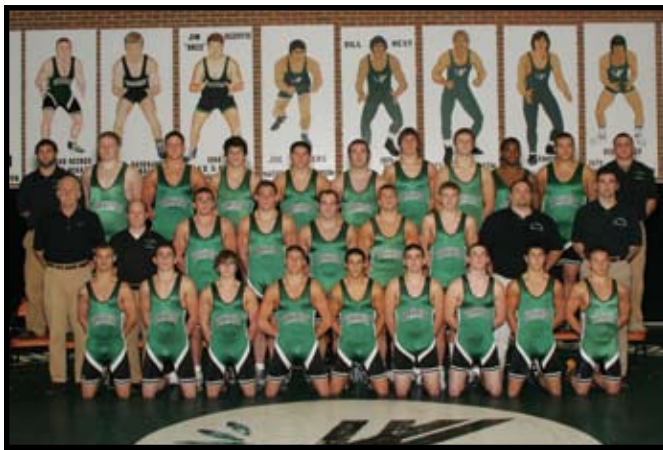

SEASON OUTLOOK

The UW-Parkside wrestling team is optimistic entering the 2006-07 season. Although the Rangers graduated three seniors with a career total of 256 wins, seven returning starters including a national champion and four national qualifiers provide a solid nucleus for this year's team. Success will depend largely on how fast the newcomers come along and the ability of the team to stay healthy.

Last year the Rangers posted a 6-1 dual meet record. Their only loss was at the hands of perennial NCAA II powerhouse University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown. The 2005-06 Rangers were ranked as high as 10th in the NCAA II national rankings, and finished 12th in the rankings and 13th in the NCAA II National Tournament.

Here is a roundup of the 2006-07 wrestling Rangers:

At 125 pounds, three legitimate contenders will vie for the position. The most experienced is junior Matt Lentz, who won 40 matches at 133-pounds during the past two years. His success depends largely on how well he handles the weight loss. Redshirt freshman Brandon Kircher had a fine high school career with a record of 119-29. True freshman Cody Zimmerman had an overall high school record of 148-9 from the same high school as the Becker brothers and with comparable success. Joe Steffen, another fine freshman, will redshirt.

At 133 pounds, junior Craig DeGreef moves up to his natural weight after posting a 34-19 record at 125 pounds the past two years. If help is needed, one of the five 125-pounders will be available. Kevin Steffen, brother of Joe, will also redshirt this year.

The 141-pound spot is manned by sophomore Craig Becker, who enjoyed a great freshman season with a 27-14 record, placing in seven tournaments and qualifying for the NCAA II Nationals. He participated in the NCAA II Nationals along with brothers Brad and Kyle, the first time in NCAA II wrestling history that three brothers competed in the same nationals. Russell Jackson will redshirt.

The 149-pound class will be short handed until the second semester when sophomore Darren Elkins returns to UW-Parkside. Darren took the fall semester off for personal reasons. He had an outstanding freshman year going 27-9 and setting a team record for takedowns by a freshman with 139.

At 157-pounds, defending NCAA II national champion and senior co-captain Brad Becker will provide both leadership and a strong presence in the middle of the lineup. Last year he was 41-7, winning titles in five tournaments. Brad Becker also recorded 19 pins, highlighted by falls in the finals of both the Midwest regional and the NCAA II nationals. His overall collegiate record is 88-29.

The 165-pound class features Kyle Becker, who enters his junior season with high expectations after placing third in the Midwest Regional last year and just missing

All-American honors in the NCAA nationals. His season record was 25-8.

The 174-pound class is again in the capable hands of senior co-captain Albert Morgan, who is a two-time NCAA II national qualifier with a career record of 62-27. Two solid backups, who will likely redshirt this season, are true freshman Luke Haag, who was 46-0 and a Wisconsin Division III state champion as a high school senior, and freshman Ryan Woods, last year's Wisconsin Division I runner-up. Other potential 174-pound candidates are Sean Shanahan and Mark Thiem. Both redshirted last year and are anxious to work their way into the lineup.

The 184-pound class will likely feature sophomore Corey VanGroll, who won 30 matches last year, mostly at 165 pounds. He is strong and skilled enough to be effective anywhere from 165 to 184 pounds. Two freshmen who can fill in are Austin Brunet, who placed fifth in the Wisconsin Division I State Championships last year, and Curtis Hines, who posted a 34-4 record as a high school senior.

At 197 pounds, redshirt-freshman Jon Tremi will step into the shoes of Luke and John Goral, who earned six All-American awards at this weight class over the past eight years for the Rangers. Tremi had a 49-5 record as a high school senior and placed second in the Wisconsin Division II State Championships. Both Brunet and Hines can fill in at this weight if necessary.

At 285 pounds, two true freshmen will challenge for the top spot. The leader is Joe Dhein, the fifth-place finisher in last year's Wisconsin Division I state tournament. He had a senior record of 35-2. His competition is Jim Dietrick, a Michigan state qualifier, who posted a 45-8 record as a senior.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

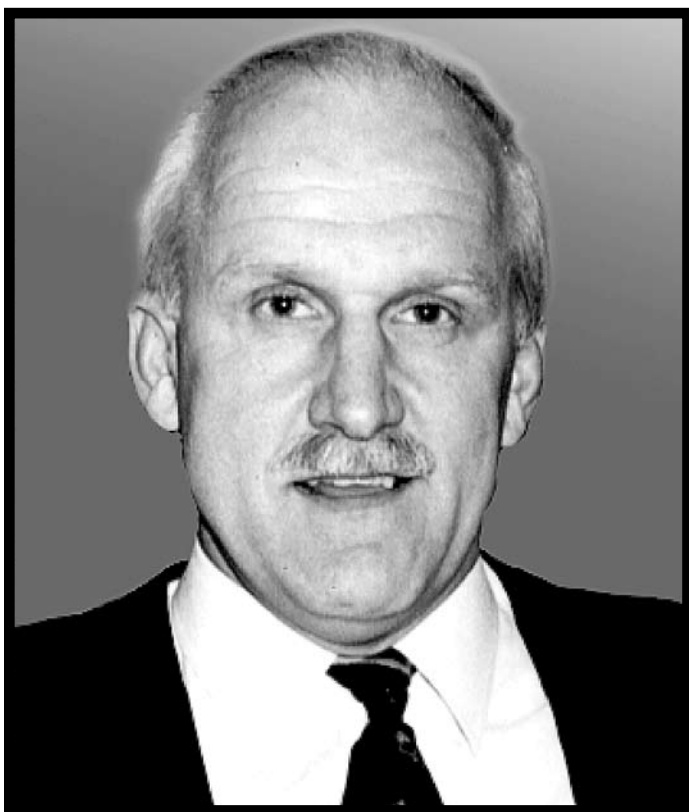
The Rangers will face some of the top competition in the country with eight regular-season tournaments on the schedule. They also have been invited to the NWCA National Dual Meet Tournament in Cedar Falls, Iowa, where they will compete against the top 15 NCAA II teams in the country. The Rangers will culminate their season at the NCAA II Midwest Regional on February 24, 2007, and at the NCAA II National Championships on March 9-10, in Kearney, Nebraska.

EXPERIENCED COACHING STAFF

Head coach Jim Koch returns for his 37th year with an eager staff of long-time assistants, Gregg Lewis, Roger Spears, Jeremie Ott, and Rick Schmoll, who together boast a total of six All-American awards. According to Koch, they all love wrestling and bring a wealth of wrestling knowledge to the practice room and enjoy sharing it with the team members.

COACHING STAFF

Head Coach Jim Koch



Jim Koch began his wrestling career in South Dakota in 1963 as a high school junior after his mother convinced the local school board to start a wrestling program. He was captain and most valuable wrestler during both his junior and senior seasons and was the first wrestler from Milbank High School to earn a medal in the state meet after going 23-1-1 as a senior. He was recruited for both football and wrestling at South Dakota State University and was awarded SDSU's prestigious Stephen F. Briggs academic scholarship. He played one season of football as a center at SDSU but decided to concentrate on wrestling when future NFL Hall-of-Fame center Jim Langer showed up at SDSU his sophomore year. He was a member of the SDSU wrestling team for four years. After an undefeated freshman season, he was the varsity 160 pounder for NCAA II Hall of Fame coach Warren Williamson's Jackrabbits for three years. As a junior he helped his team to a third-place finish in the NCAA College Division National Championships. As a senior, he was a team co-captain. He reached the finals of the North Central Conference championships all three years. He graduated with honors from SDSU in 1969.

Koch began his coaching career in 1969 as a graduate assistant at SDSU while working on his master's degree in health, physical education and recreation. The 1969-70 SDSU team finished fourth in the NCAA College Division National Tournament. Koch's highlight of the season was coaching his cousin and former high school teammate Don Trapp to the NCAA College Division National Championship at 177 pounds.

In 1970, at age 23, Koch moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin and accepted the University of Wisconsin-Parkside head wrestling coach position for its inaugural season. The 2006-07 season will be his 37th year at UW-Parkside. His 37 years coaching at the same Wisconsin university is second only to the 39 years that Byron James spent coaching at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. In his career, his teams have competed in the NCAA II Nationals 28 times and the NAIA nationals 31 times. His wrestlers have earned 47 NCAA II and 67 NAIA All-American awards. Thirteen of his wrestlers have won national championships, three in the NCAA II and 10 in the NAIA. All of his national champions have come from Wisconsin high schools. Fifty-five of his wrestlers have earned academic All-American honors, 42 in the NCAA II and 13 in the NAIA. Eighteen of his teams have finished in the top 10 at a national tournament, seven in the NCAA II and 11 in the NAIA. Three of his wrestlers have been inducted into the NAIA National Wrestling Hall of Fame and one into the NCAA II Wrestling Hall of Fame. Two of his former wrestlers, Bill West and Ken Martin, have been inducted into the George Martin Wisconsin Wrestling Hall of Fame. His team's overall dual meet record is 246-145-7.

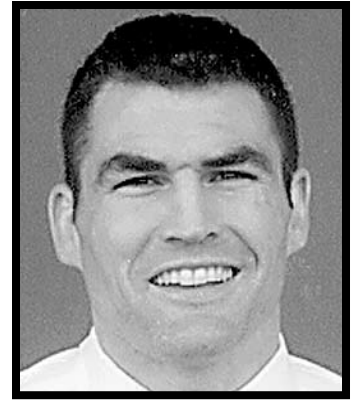
Koch has received many coaching awards. In 1971, he was selected by Amateur Wrestling News as the rookie college coach of the year. He was named by his fellow coaches as the Wisconsin NAIA wrestling coach of the year a total of six times. In 1975, he was the team leader for the first NAIA Cultural Exchange Wrestling Team to tour Japan and Korea. In 1993, he was inducted into the NAIA National Wrestling Hall of Fame, and in 2000 he was inducted into the NCAA II Wrestling Hall of Fame. In 1994, his team won the first-ever NCAA II Academic National Championship Award. In 1995, he received the Ralph Ginn Coaching Award from South Dakota State University, awarded each year to an outstanding alumnus in the coaching profession. In 2003, the National Wrestling Hall of Fame honored him with a lifetime service award. He was selected as the 2005-2006 NCAA II Midwest Regional coach of the year and the Wisconsin Wrestling Coaches Association college coach of the year. On November 3, 2006, Jim was inducted into the George Martin Wisconsin Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Koch has served the sport of wrestling and the NCAA II and NAIA in many leadership capacities. From 1977 to 1995 he was the chairman of the NAIA National Hall of Fame Committee and supervised the induction of more than 70 members. Since 1995 he has held the same position with the NCAA II and has overseen the induction of 66 members. He has also served as president of both the NAIA National Wrestling Coaches Association (1984-85) and the NCAA II National Wrestling Coaches Association (1990-92). He is currently a member of the NCAA National Wrestling Committee. Koch was also instrumental in establishing the requirements for the academic All-American awards for both the NAIA and NCAA II and he still directs the NCAA II selection committee. In 1982, 1990 and 2002, Koch served as the host coach of the NCAA II Nationals. He has directed camps and clinics at UW-Parkside, which have brought more than 6,000 high school students to the campus.

Koch is single and lives in Kenosha, Wisconsin. He is a professor in the UW-Parkside Health, Physical Education and Athletics Department. His interests include jogging, weight lifting, picture framing, raising golden retrievers and Notre Dame football.

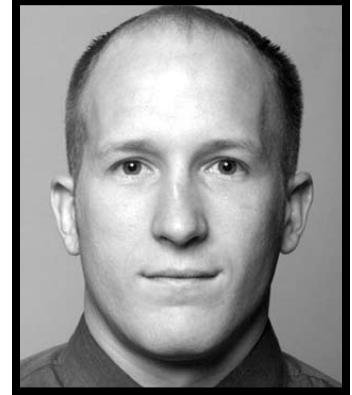
Assistant Coach Gregg Lewis

Gregg Lewis returns to UW-Parkside for his 12th year as an assistant coach. Lewis earned both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from UW-La Crosse. He has a master's in human performance. Lewis was an All-American wrestler for the Eagles, and served three years as an assistant coach at UW-La Crosse. At UW-Parkside, he is responsible for directing practices and teaching technique. He also is a master motivator. Lewis works in pharmaceutical sales. He and his wife, Amy, have a son, Gabe Vincent, and a daughter, Clohe. They live in Greendale, Wisconsin.



Assistant Coach Roger Spear

Roger Spear is in his sixth season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Rangers. He was a four-year letterwinner at UW-Parkside and posted a 94-62 record from 1993-1997. Spear earned All-American honors as a senior by placing seventh in the NCAA II Nationals. He also earned NCAA II academic All-American honors three times. He currently stands eighth on the UW-Parkside career takedowns list with 338. He was selected as a team captain his senior year. Spear placed third in the 1992 Wisconsin State Championships wrestling for Sauk Prairie High School. His high school wrestling coach was Bill West, a two-time national champion at UW-Parkside. Following his career at UW-Parkside, Spear spent four years earning a doctorate degree at the UW-Madison School of Pharmacy. He is currently a pharmacist at Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare in Racine, Wisconsin. He and his wife, Meghan, a former track and cross country athlete at UW-Parkside, live in Racine.



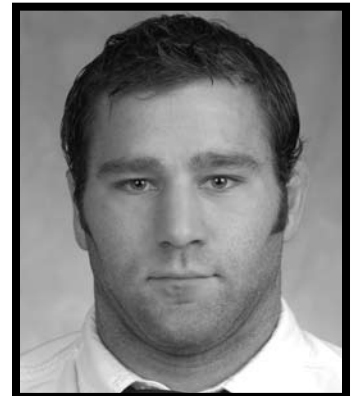
Assistant Coach Jeremie Ott

Jeremie Ott has rejoined the UW-Parkside coaching staff after a several year absence. He earlier had spent two years as a volunteer assistant coach after completing a brilliant wrestling career for the Rangers. He was a four time All-American placing eighth and third in the NAIA Nationals and he was twice an NCAA II Runnerup. Both times he took the champion into overtime. His overall collegiate record was 113-36. He is a first team selection at 177/184 pounds on the all-time UW-Parkside wrestling team and he is rated the number seven Ranger wrestler overall in the history of Parkside wrestling. Prior to attending UW-Parkside he was a Wisconsin Division II state champion for Chilton High School. He graduated from UW-Parkside in 1998 with a degree in English and a certificate in coaching. Since graduation he has worked for the Contemporary Services Corporation and currently is the branch manager of the Milwaukee office. He was the head wrestling coach at Brown Deer High School from 2003-2006. Six of his wrestlers placed in the state meet. He and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Braeden and Benjamin. They live in Glendale, Wisconsin.



Assistant Coach Rick Schmoll

Rick Schmoll is in his first year as a volunteer assistant coach for the Rangers. He was a four time letterwinner at UW-Parkside from 2003-2006. He was a starter all four years with a 63-75 career record. He earned NCAA II academic All-American honors three times. Rick is finishing his degree in biology and plans to apply for pharmacy school.



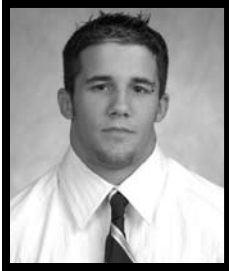

Freshman 125 lbs. Hartford, WI Major: Pre-Pharmacy

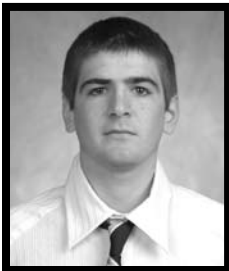

Freshman 125 lbs. Osceola, WI Major: English

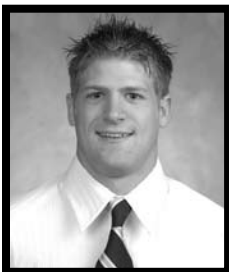

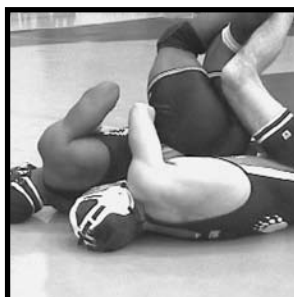


JON TREML
